



### **What is a Lexile measure?**

Some schools use a tool called Lexile measures to match students with reading material that is at their ability level. Students take a test and receive a Lexile measure. Books have been evaluated and given Lexile text measures. Pairing students with books whose Lexile measures are similar to their own provides them with successful comprehension opportunities.

### **What is the comprehension sweet spot for reading?**

The comprehension sweet spot for reading is 50 Lexile measures above and 100 Lexile measures below the student's score. This is important because you want to make sure the student is comprehending the text and being challenged enough.

### **How can I find out my student's Lexile measure?**

Your child's teacher should be able to tell you your child's Lexile score.

### **How can I find books at my child's Lexile measure?**

You can ask your child's teacher for appropriate book ideas. In addition, [Lexile.com](http://Lexile.com) allows you to identify a book's Lexile measure by typing in the title or author name. You can identify reading material by typing in a Lexile range to create a book list.

### **What if my child does not have a Lexile measure?**

Not all schools use Lexile measures. See the reading correlation chart below for other reading measurements and how they correspond to Lexile measures.
